



Post-Surgical Bandage Care for Your Pet

To help your pet heal comfortably, please follow these bandage care instructions.

Daily Bandage Checks:

- Inspect the dressing at least twice daily for cleanliness. Dressings will move a little as your pet does, but the wound should not be exposed, and it should not become damp or develop an odour.
- Watch for signs of swelling, discomfort or coldness by gently checking the area above and below the bandage.
- If your pet is licking or chewing at the bandage, it might indicate discomfort or irritation.

If you notice any of these signs, please get in touch with our team.



Exercise and indoor rest:

Your pet should remain indoors and follow the gentle exercise guidance we've recommended. Cats must be kept indoors.



Keeping the bandage dry:

Always keep the dressing clean and dry. If you need to take your pet outside, cover the bandage with a waterproof bag or protective cover, and remove it immediately once back indoors to prevent sweating or the bandage from becoming damp. Moisture can cause irritation and lead to complications.



Rechecks and follow-ups:

Please schedule a follow-up visit so we can ensure your pet is healing comfortably. This will help us to monitor your pet's progress and support with any bandaging changes required.
